The Global Social Protection Gap

Global effective coverage rates (excluding health and sickness)



46.9% of the global population

are effectively covered by at least one social protection benefit (SDG 1.3)

The Global Social Protection Financing Gap

"In **low- and middle-income countries**, the financing gap to achieve universal social protection accounts for **3.3 per cent of GDP annually**, with 2.0 per cent of GDP required for essential health care and 1.3 per cent for the five key social protection cash benefits. ... The global averages mask significant disparities among country income groups and regions. Among the former, **low-income countries** face the largest financing gap as a proportion of their GDP, amounting to **52.3 per cent**, due to large social protection coverage gaps and low GDP in these countries."

"Official development assistance becomes necessary, especially in the case of low-income countries, where the financing gap accounts for 52.3 per cent of GDP."

Global Accelerator: Organization, Financing

- Steering Group: composed of pathfinder country governments, social partners, IFIs, donors, and civil society / provides the strategic direction for all engagements on the Global Accelerator.
- Technical Support Facility: composed of a coordination team (ILO, UNICEF, UNDP, WFP, FAO and UN WOMEN), a hub of experts and country teams / facilitates & supports the implementation of the GA
- National Steering Committees: composed of participating ministries, donors, social partners, civil society, UN Resident Coordinator, participating UN agencies, development banks, and others
- Financing: Joint SDG Fund Window / GA Financing frameworks
